What your child will be learning this term:

Curriculum

Project: tremors

The children will be learning about volcanoes, earthquakes, rocks and fossils. They will be making a model volcano. In our history topic they will be studying Pompeii. We will be incorporating lots of art and DT into our learning for this project.

In Numeracy, we will be developing our knowledge of fractions, geometry, addition and subtraction and additionally they will be practising their times tables.

In our Literacy unit this half term, we will be reading 'Firework-Maker's daughter. We will be using this to create our own diaries and writing persuasive pieces.

During RE this term, we will be focusing on the Easter story.

Trips

We will be visiting a museum to study rocks and volcanoes.



Home Learning

All children should have a bag in which to carry their reading book and homework.



It is important that your child reads each day at home and that an adult hears them read. They should read for at least 15 minutes and a signature and comment should be made in their contact book about how they got on. Please also ensure that your child practices their times table, as these are key to all the Mathematical concepts.

Each Friday the children will be given ten spellings to learn for a test the following Friday.

We ask that your child completes at least 5 pieces of project home learning by the last week of term.
